THE LOCATION


When did you buy the land and did you have delays to get the block?

Buying our block of land was quite the adventure. It was about two years ago in 2021 when my partner and I stumbled upon a new suburb while driving along the Sunshine Coast. We were immediately taken by the area's charm, with its lovely greenery, parks and playgrounds, and new developments that seemed to be popping up everywhere. As we walked up to the sales office, we could see that it was a hive of activity. People were milling around, signing documents, and finalizing their purchases.

As we spoke to the sales representative, we learned that there was just one 250sqm block left. We knew we had to act fast if we wanted to secure it. We later found out that people had been camping out all night to secure a block of land, and we felt incredibly fortunate to have stumbled upon it by chance.



Although we had no idea how we were going to pay for it or build a house on it at the time, we knew we had to take the opportunity while it was still available.



We were living in Brisbane and were driving up to the Sunshine Coast to go to the beach every single weekend. With that in mind, we decided maybe this is where we wanted to be and began looking at what we could afford.







THE BRIEF

we prioritised having the master bedroom towards the back of the home, so it wasn't next to the road. We also wanted lots of light, however our budget could only allow for a single storey home design. So, we upgraded to 1700mm high ceilings to counteract the smaller floor plan feeling. I think the biggest thing was having an island bench, as well as, the living, dining and kitchen to have direct access to the backyard. There weren't a lot of floorplans where this was the case for a block as small as ours. We came across the Brooklyn floor plan and were super happy. We allowed for the bedroom to be next to the kitchen because this floorplan had the main thing we

wanted, which was the island bench and direct access to the backyard. The driveway and the laundry being accessible to both the garage and the kitchen was an absolute winner for me because getting the shopping in was easy. You can go straight into the kitchen. It is the best thing. Having a separate laundry was really important for me. A lot of other home designs from other builders had the laundry in the garage which I didn't really like as my garage is my studio and workshop. When you use your garage to store your car I can understand having the laundry in there, but if you're using it solely for your studio, it's not practical. It wouldn't worry me if it was a double garage, but we have a single.





We had a broker from whom we bought an apartment recently. We kind of talked to her and mentioned we might do something. Not long after we accidently did the 'something.' She was like "Oh My God, I don't know if I can," but she did.



THE FACADE

Our home is a true reflection of our personal style, and we wanted it to be a reflection of our new love for coastal living. We were particularly drawn to the weatherboard look, which is so common in beachside communities. We opted for a white exterior, which looks incredibly bright and fresh against the lush green grass that surrounds our property. Our entrance from the street is truly eye-catching, thanks to the beautiful pink door that we added. It's a fun and playful touch that gives a hint of what people can expect once they step inside. We wanted the entrance to be warm and welcoming, and the pink door definitely

achieves that. Landscaping was also a major consideration for us. Despite our smaller block size, we wanted to prioritise having a lush green lawn and a palm tree. We've always loved the way palm trees look, and since we've moved to Queensland, they're a common sight everywhere we go. We also added some beautiful plants and flowers that complement the coastal vibe of our home. Overall, we're really happy with the way our home looks from the street. It's a true reflection of our style and personality, and it always puts a smile on our faces when we pull up to our driveway.

Are there any features that are a standout in your home?

While the cabinets themselves are pretty standard, I wanted to add my own personal touch to them. So, I designed and built a facade for the cabinets myself, which has completely transformed the space.

The living room is now one of the most comfortable and cosy spaces in our home. We spend a lot of time here, whether we're watching movies, playing games, or just relaxing on the couch. It's the perfect place to unwind after a long day.

Another standout feature in our home is the overall design aesthetic. We wanted to create a fun and playful vibe throughout the house, and I think we've achieved that.

It's definitely a unique look, but we love it and it feels like a true reflection of our personalities. For those who are considering building a new home in the future, I have two pieces of advice.



Firstly, if you can afford it, invest in ducted air conditioning. While we opted for split air conditioners, we've ended up installing four units which have taken up precious space in our backyard.

"In hindsight, the cost of a ducted system would have been similar, and it would have saved us a lot of hassle."

Secondly, consider investing in high ceilings. This can really transform the look and feel of your home, making the space feel larger and more open. While it may be a bit more expensive upfront, it's definitely worth it in the long run as it can add value to your property and make it a more enjoyable place to live.
